Canon Colin writes...

Sa Saints Peter and Paul are celebrated together on June 29th because they $\frac{1}{6.0}$ are both considered foundational figures in the early Christian Church 60 and are believed to have been martyred in Rome around the same time, 6.3 during the reign of Emperor Nero. While historical accounts vary slightly, Su 8.3 they are honoured together as pillars of the Church, particularly in 9.0 Rome, and their ministries, though distinct, were united in spreading the 9.3 Gospel. 9:3

Both Peter and Paul were prominent figures in the early Church. Peter, one of the Twelve Apostles, is considered the first Pope and a key leader. Paul, originally a persecutor of Christians, became a crucial missionary and theologian, known for his letters in the New Testament.

Tradition holds that both were martyred in Rome during Nero's reign. While accounts differ on the exact dates, they are traditionally commemorated on the same day, June 29th.

10 Despite their different backgrounds and roles, they are celebrated Tu together to symbolize the unity of the Church and the universality of the 10 Gospel message. They represent different aspects of Christian faith and 10 practice, Peter as the "rock" upon which the Church was built and Paul 10 as the preacher to the Gentiles.

Each one of us needs to express attributes of both the Petrine and Pauline ministries in our lives. Like Peter we need to be firm in our faith (although a few wobbles are permitted!) Like Paul we also must become fearless missionaries, prepared to suffer rejection for the sake of the Gospel. After all, we are only here because of the commitment of our predecessors, the Church will only thrive in the future through our willingness to serve the Gospel as St Peter and St Paul did to such an outstanding degree.



In those days: Herod the king laid violent hands on some who belonged to the church. He killed James the brother of John with the sword, and when he saw that it pleased the Jews, he proceeded to arrest Peter also. This was during the days of Unleavened Bread. And when he had seized him, he put him in prison, delivering him over to four squads of soldiers to guard him, intending after the Passover to bring him out to the people. So Peter was kept in prison, but earnest prayer for him was made to God by the church. Now when Herod was about to bring him out, on that very night, Peter was sleeping between two soldiers, bound with two chains, and sentries before the door were guarding the prison. And behold, an angel of the Lord stood next to him, and a light shone in the cell. He struck Peter on the side and woke him, saying, 'Get up quickly.' And the chains fell off his hands. And the angel said to him, 'Dress yourself and put on your sandals.' And he did so. And he said to him, 'Wrap your cloak round you and follow me.' And he went out and followed him. He did not know that what was being done by the angel was real, but thought he was seeing a vision. When they had passed the first and the second guard, they came to the iron gate leading into the city. It opened for

them of its own accord, and they went out and went along one street, and immediately the angel left him. When Peter came to himself, he said, 'Now I am sure that the Lord has sent his angel and rescued me from the hand of Herod and from all that the Jewish people were expecting.' The word of the Lord. **Thanks be to God.**
